- Children are well dressed in school uniforms and shoes.

CHALLENGES

- There is need to have 3 or more teachers to help in lower, middle and upper sections of the school.
- All P2 members have no shoes because the ones they had are worn out.

- The District officials want us to eliminate “AIDS ORPHANS” because it reminds the children of the impact of AIDS causing them to be orphans.
